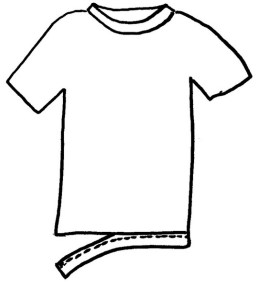


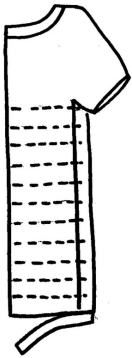
T-SHIRT YARN

Made From Upcycled T-Shirts



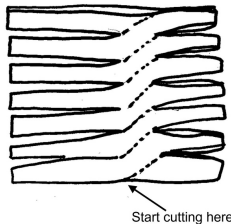
1 CUT OFF HEM

Remove the bottom hem of a t-shirt with no side seams. Flatten your t-shirt out and fold it in half lengthwise, but leave it unfolded about one to two inches.



2 CUT INTO 1 INCH STRIPS

Cut the desired width of strips horizontally, BUT DO NOT CUT ALL THE WAY ACROSS! **Stop cutting** just past the fold of the top layer. Continue cutting strips all the way up the shirt.



3 CUT ON DIAGNOL

To make a continual strip of yarn, slide your arm between the layers and adjust it so the uncut area is accessible over your arm. As indicated on the drawing, start cutting on the bottom strip (through the single layer of fabric) at an angle to the end of the cut edge. On the next layer cut from one end to the other **ON A DIAGANOL!** Follow that same pattern until you've cut all strips.



4 PULL STRIPS AND WIND INTO A BALL

To finish the strips into yarn, simply pull the strips. When you pull the strips, they'll curl onto itself making a nice yarn. Wrap into a ball and store them in a cute basket.
